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INTRODUCTION

The Norman Wells expediting operation consisted of two expeditors, two trucks, telephone and communication radios; a mobile trailer was used for office and sleeping quarters. Whenever possible crew members in transit stayed in this trailer. Fuel, food, aircraft and other essential supplies were co-ordinated by the expeditor for the field operations.

The fuel consumption per day was 1400 gallons of diesel fuel and 5 gallons of gasoline. Fuels and lubricants were purchased from a bulk station in Norman Wells.

Canadian Airlines Int. was utilized from southern Canada to ship both men and parts to Norman Wells. The reverse was the rule upon completion of the winter's season. Various sizes of fixed-wing aircraft and helicopter were used on a charter basis. These aircraft transported personnel, food and parts.

Weather conditions during the course of the program were normal with temperatures in the -25°C range in February. As the amount of daylight increased the temperature moderated into April. No recording production was lost due to weather conditions.

Recording started on March 29th, 1988 on the Fort Good Hope 3-D program. We continued work until program was completed on April 5th, 1988. All equipment then went on to work for another client.

A SUMMARY OF THE 1988 MOBIL OIL SEISMIC EXPLORATION PROGRAM'S
ECONOMIC ASSISTANCE TO THE COMMUNITY OF NORMAN WELLS AND
RESIDENTS OF THE NORTHWEST TERRITORIES:

LOCAL PERSONNEL

A total of twenty-two residents of the N.W.T. were hired by Western Geophysical for the 1988 season. Job categories were diverse as some residents have acquired job skills with previous years of service with Western. The line crew was comprised of men from Colville Lake, Fort Franklin, Fort Good Hope, Fort Norman and Norman Wells working as helpers and cable truck operators. One environmental monitor was hired with the consultation of the various hunters and trappers' associations. The expediter based in Norman Wells hired residents of the community on a casual basis when necessary.

The percentage of northern residents versus employees from Alberta calculated as 49% of the "Western" crew. Twenty-Two Thousand, Four Hundred Fifteen Dollars (\$22,415.00) was paid to northern residents in wages during the work period in which the seismic crew operated. This figure excludes the monitor's Ski-doo which amounted to One Thousand, One Hundred Dollars (\$1,100.00).

Attached is a summary of the N.W.T. residents employed during the Fort Good Hope 3-D project.

AIR SERVICE

Canadian Airlines Int. were utilized to transport personnel and equipment from Alberta to Norman Wells and the return. Approximately Thirteen Thousand Six Hundred Thirty One Dollars and Twenty-Three Cents (\$13,631.23) was expended for this service.

Local charter companies were utilized to fly men and equipment from the outlying communities and Norman Wells to the work location. Buffalo Airways, Nahanni Air, Page Flight Services and Okanagan Helicopter were used on a casual basis. The total expenditure for local charter services was approximately Fifty Four Thousand Nine Hundred Forty One Dollars and Sixty Six Cents (\$54,941.66).

CONSTRUCTION AND TRUCKING CONTRACTORS

Cat services were supplied by Borek Construction Ltd. Matco was used in town for hauling heavy equipment to the airplanes. One Hundred Nine Thousand, Five Hundred Dollars (\$109,500.00) was expended for equipment and supplies.

FUELS AND LUBRICANTS

The Imperial Oil bulk station in Norman Wells supplied diesel, gas and oils for crew consumption. Approximately Fifty-Five Thousand, Two Hundred Forty-Six Dollars (\$55,246.00) was expended for combustibles. This figure does not include aviation fuels that were purchased directly by the airline companies.

LOCAL SUPPLIERS

Hudson Bay Company supplied the field crew with food and camp supplies from their local warehouse. Approximately Twelve Thousand, One Hundred Dollars (\$12,100.00) was spent on these items.

Parts and accessories were purchased from various suppliers whenever possible. The local suppliers included Mississquoi Electric Ltd., Acklands Ltd., Inuvik Automotive Westlund Ltd., Canol Welding, Wellponic Well Services, and Norman Wells Transportation Ltd. Total amount expended to these businesses was approximately Four Thousand, Five Hundred Fifty-One Dollars and Twenty-Four Cents (\$4,551.24).

Commissary supplies purchased locally by crew members along with the taxi rides, hotel rooms and entertainment brought local expenditures up to approximately Two Thousand, Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00).

CONCLUSION

The economic contribution of the Fort Good Hope 3-D to the Northwest Territories was in the neighborhood of Two Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand, Nine Hundred Eighty-Five Dollars (\$275,985.00).

The employment of 22 local residents along with supply purchases from small business contributed economically and socially to the welfare of the area.
