

THE CONSOLIDATED MINING AND SMELTING COMPANY OF CANADA LIMITEDMINES DIVISIONNORTH CENTRAL DISTRICT.PINE POINT OILSUMMARY OF EXPLORATION
DURING FIRST EIGHTEEN MONTH'S PERIOD OF PERMITS.

The operation designated as "Pine Point Oil" consisted of the drilling of two stratigraphic test holes, utilizing a standard diamond drill rig adapted for the purpose, in the area comprised of Petroleum and Natural Gas Permits 435, 436, 437, 547 and 548.

(a) Items of Expenditure Set forth in a separate report.

(b) Location of Work Done Two stratigraphic test holes were drilled in the following locations:

(1) Hole G1 - Located in Pine Point claim area approximately two miles west of the original base camp, Lat 60°50' N and Long 114°20' W and in Permit No. 437.

(2) Hole G4 - Sulphur Point on south shore of Great Slave Lake. Approximately at 60°54' N Lat and 114°46' W Long. On permit No. 548.

A plan showing the locations is attached.

(c) Permits upon which work is to be Applied The work is to be applied on Permits 435, 436, 437, 547, and 548 which were grouped under the regulations.

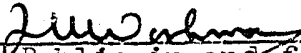
(d) Specific Purpose for Each Item of Expenditure All expenditures were directly for the purpose of drilling stratigraphic test holes G1 and G4. No other type of exploration was carried out. Details are covered under (a) Items of Expenditure as set forth in a separate report.

(e) Summary of Work Done

The work consisted of the drilling of two stratigraphic test holes, designated G1 and G4. Both were drilled with a Boyles EBS2 model diamond drill equipped with accessories necessary for oil and gas exploration. Footage drilled on the two holes totalled 2536 feet. Summarized logs are as follows:

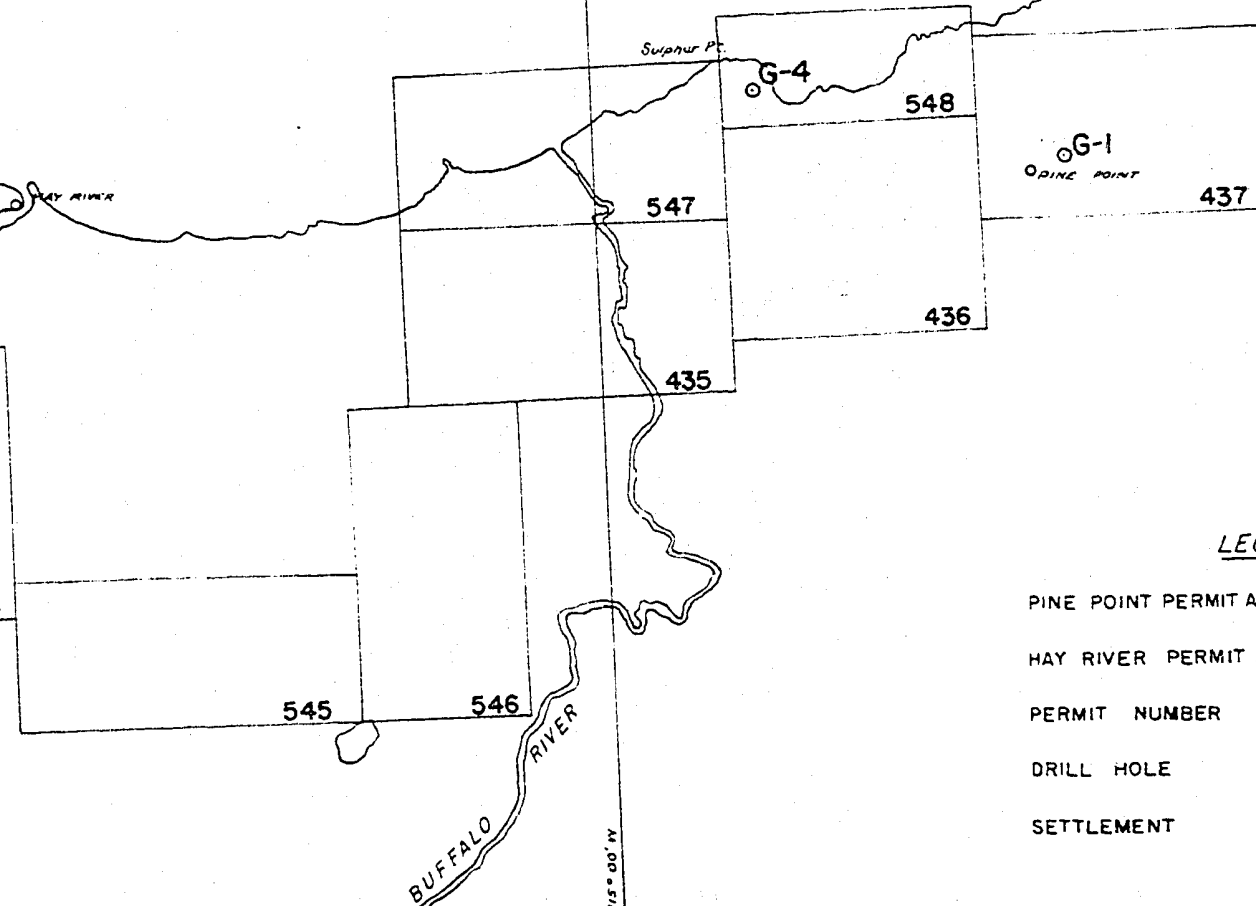
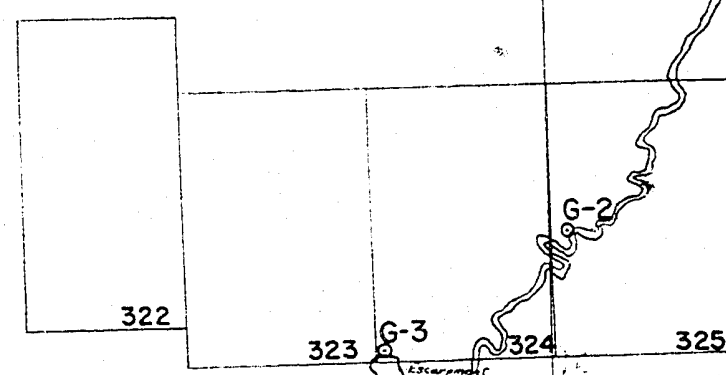
